- An income of less than £1 million in the most recent financial year (we will
 preference organisations with an income of less than £500,000)
- A governing document in the name of your organisation with charitable objectives
- A UK bank account in the name of your organisation with two unrelated signatories
- Signed accounts with income and expenditure for the most recent financial year
 OR

A 12 month financial forecast with income and expenditure for new organisations

What can your organisation apply for?
